



Big Bird Bio

The ostrich is a very strange bird, but one thing it does not do is hide its head in the sand. Some people believe that when an ostrich is scared, it buries its head under the ground. What really happens is that a frightened ostrich will drop to the ground, stick out its neck parallel with it, and watch carefully. If there is real danger, the ostrich will get up and run. Running might seem strange because the ostrich is a bird. However, it cannot fly. It makes up for being flightless by being one of the fastest runners in the animal kingdom. An ostrich can run up to 70 miles per hour and maintain top speeds for half a mile. An ostrich's long legs can also deliver a powerful forward kick. The ostrich is the largest of all birds. It can grow up to eight feet in height and weigh 300 pounds. The ostrich is the egg-laying champion among birds. Ostrich eggs measure up to seven inches long and six inches around. One ostrich egg is as heavy as two dozen chicken eggs. Ostriches have no teeth. They swallow pebbles to grind their food. In some African countries, ostriches are made to wear special saddles and bridles. People climb on their backs and have races, just like we do with horses.




